


### Retrofitting

- Three quarters (75%) of Germans would be likely to make their home more energy efficient if they had the financial support and other resources they needed
  - Over half (53%) would be **very likely** to do this
- 16% admit they are **not very likely** to make their home more energy efficient
- And just 9% would **not be likely at all**
- Motivating factors for improving home energy efficiency include:
  - 1. Cheaper energy bills (54%)
  - 2. Being more **environmentally friendly** (48%)
  - 3. Keeping warmer in winter/cooler in summer (46%)
  - 4. To live in a healthier building (29%)
  - 5. Cheaper mortgage (14%)
  - 6. To be able to **re-sell** the home more easily (13%)

## Which of the following would be contributing factors to you not making your home more energy efficient (retrofitting)?



#### Insight

- Over half (51%) of Germans say that cost is a barrier to making their home more energy efficient
- This was followed by:
  - Not knowing what needs to be done (17%)
  - Hassle to organise the necessary finance (16%)




### **Resources and Perks**

- More than a fifth (21%) admit they are not knowledgeable at all on applying for funding support, finding advice on what to do and finding qualified workers
- Over a third (34%) are **not very knowledgeable**
- While more than two fifths (44%) believe they are knowledgeable on applying for funding support, finding advice on what to do and finding qualified workers
  - 10% are very knowledgeable
- 73% agree that they would support mandatory energy efficiency improvements if there was financial support, renovation advice and information on where to find qualified workers available
  - More than a quarter (29%) strongly agree
- 5% **disagree** that they would support this
- Two thirds (67%) are **aware** of the **personal finance benefits** to **improving** their **home's energy efficiency** 
  - A fifth (20%) are very aware
- While just under a quarter (23%) are **not very aware**
- And 10% are not aware at all


#### Question:

## If you made your home more energy efficient, what perks do you think should be available to you?



### Insight

- Almost three fifths (58%) think that a government grant/rebate should be available to those who make their home more efficient
- Other perks include:
  - Home purchase tax exemption/relief (29%)
  - Cheaper mortgage/loans (21%)



### **Energy Efficiency**

- Over three quarters (77%) say energy efficiency ratings are/would be important when buying or moving home
  - 36% say these are **very important**
- Just 5% think that energy efficiency ratings are **unimportant**
- 79% think it is **important** that **buildings** in general (including homes, offices, schools, hospitals etc.) are **energy efficient** 
  - Two fifths (40%) believe this is **very important**
- While 5% think that the general energy efficiency of buildings is unimportant
- 62% agree that it is an individual's social responsibility to make their home as energy efficient and climate friendly as possible (taking financial and residential constraints into account)
  - More than a fifth (21%) strongly agree
- 10% **disagree** that this is the case
